The culmination of the Christmas activities was a dinner for all the people in the church – tired and somewhat exhausted from their activities but with a feeling of great blessing.

Edi, in his update, has asked for prayers for those who have been to the church and that they will continue to attend and learn more of the love of Christ for them; for the new believers that they can be discipiled in the ways of the Lord; for the continued growth of the church; for Edi and his family as they continue to serve the Lord in Albania.

Finally, Edi sends his thanks for the support he has received through the work of Radstock Ministries and that this might continue to further the Lord's work in his church and the wider church in Albania. Last year we were able to send £50.00 to Radstock Ministries from our giving to the work of Home and Overseas Missions and from Edi's update we know that our gift is helping to make a difference.

Through generous giving during our Christingle service in December (seems a long time ago now) we were able to pass on the Coventry City Mission the sum of £265.00, which has been put towards the costs of the Mission Foodbank. The staff at the Mission send their thanks and appreciation.

Several hundred tins of food go out from the Mission every week to feed families in need. On average the Mission makes up thirty parcels a week for over one hundred adults and children. There is a box in the church vestibule for this life-line if you would like to make a donation.

In February the Mission began two new initiatives with Moat House Primary School. The first is that the Mission Children's Worker is running a weekly after-school group for infant school pupils, which is proving very popular. The second initiative is the Lunch Club.

In March the Mission launched their Uniform Bank which took them into partnership with several local schools who refer families to the Mission where they are finding it difficult to meet the cost of providing uniform for their growing children. The families have access to the uniform bank for the clothes.

If you have any school uniforms which are no longer needed by your children and would like to donate them (the uniforms) to the Uniform Bank then please place them in the box in our vestibule. All the Mission asks is that garments have been washed please. Any colour uniform will be accepted, with or without school identifiers.

The Mission also provides vital services through Eldercare and Crossline for the elderly and lonely, and seeks our prayers for the continued work for all the services and
